Ann McGilvrey Award

It is time to propose candidates for the prestigious McGilvrey Award for sportsmanship and ethics. This award honors a District 5 player, or in some cases a pair, who epitomize(s) ethical behavior and good sportsmanship at the bridge table. On June 8, 1973 the District V bridge community suffered the loss of Ann Lytle McGilvrey, Ralph Vichill and Lee Coito in a tragic boating accident. In honor of Ann's memory, and her reputation as one who exemplified the highest standards of sportsmanship and ethical behavior at the bridge table, the Board of Directors of District V instituted the Ann McGilvrey Award. It is presented at the May regional each year to a player or partnership who reflects those same positive qualities. These recipients are not chosen on the basis of service or bridge ability. Only past winners are invited to participate in the selection process. Typically the selection committee will look for someone who has established a districtwide reputation for active ethics and good manners. Here is a list of previous winners, with the year if known:

(A) Active Membership Trend -

Over the last 12 months we lost in overall membership. We were 10th out of the 13 units in our district.

(B) New Members Gains -

Our unit did quite well in this category; this last year Unit 185 signed up 6 new members, which was 3rd in District 5.

(C) Member Losses -

We were last in the district for the most members lost.

(D) New Member Retention % in Year 2 -

Unit 185 was 4th in our district.

(E) Average Member Age -

We are the second youngest in District 5; the average age of the members in our unit is under 66 years old.

(F) Average Years of ACBL Membership -

This category is the best for Unit 185. Our unit has the most years of ACBL membership per member at almost 23 years per member.

The Allegheny Mountain Unit #185 will hold a 299er Sectional Tournament on Saturday, April 22, 2006. This tournament will be a 2-session, morning and afternoon event and will be held at the Comfort Inn in Johnstown. I hope all our members will plan to attend. 

Here's Dan in action in a five club contract:



After a lively auction and the opening lead of the ace of hearts, Dan observed that he had a spade problem, as West had opened the bidding one spade virtually guaranteeing that the spade Ace sat behind the King. Dan solved his spade problem in a most unusual fashion by using his Ace of diamonds for a brief moment then jettisoning it when it was no longer needed. At trick two, East shifted to a trump won in hand, and a trump was returned to dummy. The Queen of diamonds was successfully finessed as East refused to cover with the King. The King of hearts was now cashed on which Dan pitched the no longer needed diamond Ace and Dan continued with a diamond from dummy. No matter which way the defense squirmed Dan now had 11 tricks.

He scored seven clubs, three diamonds and a heart to bring home the bacon and cinch a spot in Dallas. With play like that Dan and Jim appear to have a bright future at the Nationals.

District Director's Report December 2005

Denver in the fall proved to be delightful! All the playing space was at the Adam's Mark Hotel. Restaurants were plentiful and transportation up and down 16th Street was free and ran frequently.

At the Board of Governor's meeting, President Roger Smith announced that Roni Gitchel would be one of two people receiving the President's Volunteer Medal at the Goodwill Meeting in Dallas in the spring. This award recognizes volunteers that go above and beyond in service to bridge. This is only the second year that this has been awarded. I think we can all agree that Roni is a perfect candidate!

The results of this year's elections were certified. For District 5 Mary Paulone Carns, Brian Ellis and Brian Meyer were elected to the Board of Governors. Their new terms commence January 1, 2006. Congratulations to all of them.

Membership is steady, but the expenses keep going up. ACBL is projecting a large deficit this year (2005). We have consciously spent more on marketing than we have in the past. Some of those things are being pared back, but the bottom line is that fees are going up in 2006

Rating point games will go from \$.65 to \$.74 on 4/1/06.

On 1/1/06 the following will go up:

- Stack Fee up \$.30 to \$2.72
- Progressive Sectional (qualifying) from \$2.65 to \$3.04
- Sectional Surcharge increased from \$110 to \$135
- Tournament Director Fees increased by 7%
- Supply Fees increased from \$.85 to \$.95
- Tournament Assistant test fee increased from \$25 to \$50
- NABC entry fees increased \$1.50 per session

There were 3 sites proposed for future NABC's. We will be going to Memphis in the spring of 2012 to celebrate 75 years as an

organization. Plans are underway to make this a very special event. We will be returning to San Francisco in the fall of 2012 and this package came with some real savings for the NABC in San Francisco in 2007. An NABC in Montreal in the fall of 2013 was rejected because the package would require three separate playing sites. However, a motion that the Board reconsider this decision passed at the meeting of the Board of Governors so we will revisit this decision in the spring.

A regional and sectional allocation committee studied the way tournaments are scheduled and what is done in the case of a conflict. The biggest change is the establishment of an arbitration board to rule on the conflicts. For complete details please check this report on the website.

The Committee that has been studying the Grand National Teams and the North American Pairs has come up with residence criteria for playing in the two events. For the GNT a member's principal physical residence as of September 1st of the year prior to the National Finals shall establish the District in which the member is eligible to participate. For the NAP the date will be June 1st of the prior year. Entering the event is a statement that you are eligible in that District and violation is subject to penalties. Credentials Committee will rule on all disputes. If a player wishes an exception he must start the process no fewer than 60 days before the start of the club level games. For Flight A and the Championship Flight the player must seek permission in writing from the District Directors in both Districts. Both must agree or it can't be done. The permission of both District Directors will be forwarded to the Credentials Committee for final approval.

The Mini Spingold will run no longer than 5 days.

At local host option, regional fast open pair events at NABCs may be 24, 26 or 27 boards.

Discussion of ACBL World Junior Camp was deferred to spring.

From January 1 to June 30, ACBL will have an amnesty period. People whose membership has lapsed can retrieve lost points by paying their dues during that time.

Except for charity events or events limited to players with fewer than 20 Masterpoints, sectionals will charge at least an additional \$1.00 and regionals will charge at least an additional \$2.00 per person per session for non-members and non-service paying LMs. This money will be retained by the sponsoring organization. This is now mandatory.

A motion to have a USA-Canada Friendship Trophy contested in districts on both sides of the border was tabled for more details.

Player number L248224 who was charged with playing while on ACBL suspension was expelled.

In an appeal of the findings of a Disciplinary Committee, player number L200507 was placed on 18 month's suspension and will be on probation until the end of 2009.

During the Denver NABC the Ethical Oversight Committee had a hearing regarding two ACBL members suspected of cheating in another Bridge Organization. Those players were expelled from the ACBL.

In a departure from our usual schedule, the Grand National Teams will be contested May 6-7 in Meadville PA. Look for details in the 5th Column.

Pittsburgh Potpourri

As bridge players, we know that skill is only one of the factors in victory. Chance matters. Often the worse bids make the best boards, and mistakes in defense or play can produce the greatest number of matchpoints. I was involved in two such instances at club games this month and was justly accused of being lucky (truly a rarity in my bridge life). In the first, I intended to bid 4 diamonds, but pulled out the 4 heart card instead. I got doubled by the player in the balance seat.

The double was passed by me, as I hoped the opponent might bid. He did not, but my partner, despite having three hearts, bid his seven card spade suit. He was promptly doubled and went down three doubled. When the traveller was opened, we discovered we had earned a top, because six or seven hearts was played at every other table successfully. Of course, when my hand was tabled with no hearts, the opponents were most unhappy. In the other instance, I thought I had led the Ace of Spades from my holding of AKQ tight against a four heart contract, when I actually led the two of diamonds from my 32 holding. It was the only lead to set the contract, and again we gained a top. The opponents were indeed fixed in both examples. I am not proud of either play, and unfortunately they provide proof of why I will never be a top player even though I must compete in the A flights because I have over 3000 points (perfect attendance helped).

The Steelers are now leading 35 to 21 in the third, but it is not a comfortable margin. I am still only hoping. Look at our advertisement for our March Sectional – that I'm comfortable about. Vincie is in charge. This means it will be ORGANIZED, RICHLY HOSPITABLE, AND GREAT FUN. It
