Sharon Fairchild Elected ACBL President for 2007

We are delighted to report that District 5's Representative to the ACBL, **Sharon Fairchild**, was elected President for 2007. The election took place at the National Board of Directors' meetings at the Summer Nationals in Chicago.

Sharon has a long history of service to bridge going back over 25 years. She was a member of the Toledo, Ohio Unit Board and served as Regional Facilities Coordinator. She moved to Cleveland in 1981 and was elected to the Unit Board, and served as the Unit President for two terms. Sharon has either chaired or co-chaired nearly every Rock and Roll and All-American Regional since 1992.

Having served as District Representative since 1998, Sharon ran unopposed for her fourth term this year.



Sharon lives in Rocky River, Ohio with her husband, Stan, a retired Senior Consultant with British Petroleum. She is the mother of three successful children and has two wonderful grandchildren.

Her focus for the year will be on novices. This will be a two-pronged approach – (1) making sure that the novices feel that they are appreciated and (2) encouraging the more experienced players to treat novices well and show how that can affect the demographics of the game. Novices are the largest group in the ACBL.

District 5 has had two previous ACBL presidents. Jim Ferguson of Pittsburgh was president in 1960 and Jim Zimmerman of Cleveland was president in 1981.

We are certain that Sharon will do her usual great job and, as a District, we are very proud of you. Have a great year, Sharon!

Many Unit 185 players attended other sectionals that were held outside our area. In March, Pittsburgh was the site of one and on Saturday afternoon in the 199ers, **George Zdravecky** and **Leida Milazzo** were 5A/3B/1C. In the Saturday Open Pairs, **Rhoda Zdravecky** and **Pat Reynolds** were 2C. The next sectional was held in State College. The Susquehanna Sectional was on May 5, 6, and 7 and our local winners in the Saturday Open Pairs in the afternoon were **Newton Taylor** and **John Bowser** at 6B/3C and **Mary Moran** and **Beatrice Stevens**, who were 5C. In the evening, Mary and Beatrice were 2C.

The Greensburg Sectional was held the second weekend in June at the Saint Joseph Center. The big story there was that the 199er Trophy for Overall Performance was awarded to a couple from Johnstown who had less than 5 masterpoints. **John** and **Pat Gundermann** won this trophy by playing just one day, Saturday, when they were 1A/1B in the afternoon and 2A/1B in the evening. They won enough masterpoints on that one day to carry them to victory for the trophy. Other winners at Greensburg;

in the Friday afternoon 199ers, **Rose** and **Vince Saccone** were 5B and the Friday Open Pairs had **Marge Ajay** and **Carol Robson** at 3B with **Mary Moran** and **Beatrice Stevens** at 5C. Others who won masterpoints but did not place in the overalls were **Jean Green**, **Jeanine Fagley**, **Anna Magee**, and **Muriel Oswalt**.

Some of our unit's future Life Masters placed in the District V's "Ace of Clubs" and Mini-McKenney mid-year listings. The "Ace of Clubs" had **Joseph Schettig** 5th in the 0/5 category, **George Zdravecky** 9th in the 5/20, **Leida Milazzo** 23rd in the 20/50, and in the 200/300 class **Gail Kevenk** was # 10 and **Dave Livingston** was # 24. The Mini-McKenney "Rookie" 0/5 masterpoints class had **Joseph Schettig** 12th and **John** and **Pat Gundermann**, the trophy winners, 22nd. The 5/20 category showed 11th place going to **George Zdravecky**.

This is for Silver Masterpoints and there will be two separate games. The games start at 10:30am and lunch will be provided after the first session. 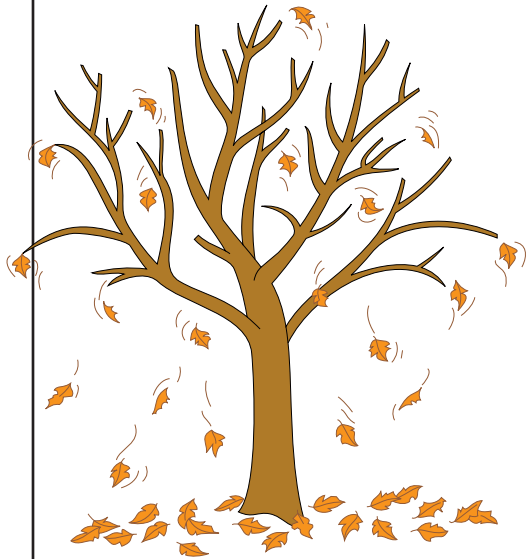

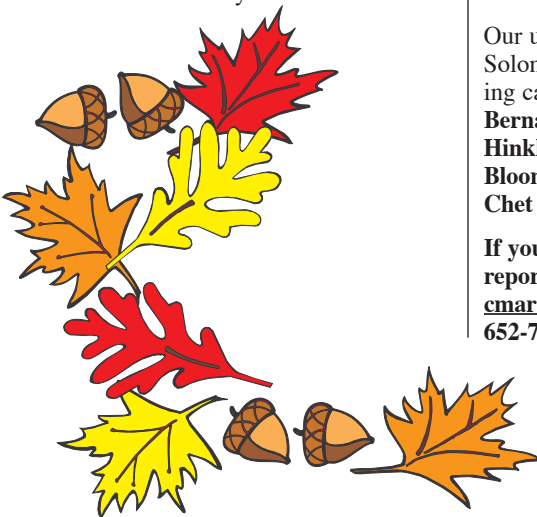

Autumn Sectional – The Autumn Sectional is going to be different this year. The times for the Friday and Saturday game have changed. Although the first session on Friday remains at 1:30 pm, the evening session will begin at **7:00 pm**. The Saturday sessions will begin at **10:00 am** and **2:00 pm**. This should allow players more time for their Saturday night social events. The other change is that the **Sunday events will be Two Session Play – Through PAIRS, Stratified Open and Stratified 499ers**. For the team players there will be a **Three Session Bracketed Handicap KO Team event, with the first session at 7:00 p.m. on Friday and the final two sessions on Saturday**.

The Autumn Sectional will be held at the Tadmor Temple on October 6-7-8. The Tadmor Temple is easy to find for everyone driving south on **Interstate 77**. Go to the #120 exit (Arlington Road). 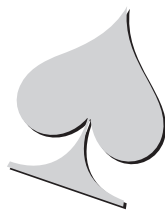
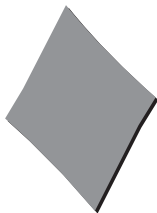

A STaC is a Sectional Tournament at Clubs.

This is how it works:

A **STaC** is essentially a SECTIONAL Tournament except that the individual sections of the SECTIONAL take place at individual clubs, at or about the same time, instead of together at one large location. Every game at every participating club you attend during **STaC** Week may be part of the tournament. The results of the game you play in will be combined with the results from all of the other clubs playing at the same time and one giant OVERALL will be tallied. Let's say that Olean, Canton, Greensburg, Cumberland and Parkersburg are all playing at the same time. Scoring is first done on a club-by-club basis and SILVER points awarded for each section. Then the results of all four games are combined as if everyone were playing under one roof. Highest percentage score is first overall, next is second overall, and so forth. Because you are competing against so many people, you can earn a lot of points. All of them, whether they are section awards or overall awards, will be SILVER.

Yes, it will cost a little more to play in a **STaC** game. ACBL sanction fees are higher and a director must be paid to coordinate the gathering and issuing of points.
